How to Be More Than Conquerors Presenter: Elder Teresa McCalister Prayer Meeting Handout 8/14/23

Scripture: "Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him that loved us." Romans 8:37

I. Conquer with More Prayer

"But in everything by prayer...let your requests be made known unto God" (Philippians 4:6).

A. Many Christians lack victory because they neglect to pray. Some pray about the big things that happen but forget that it is "the little foxes that spoil the vines" (Song of Solomon 2:15).

Little foxes that might be in your vineyard:

- Quarreling with other Christians (1 Corinth. 3:1-3)
- Pride (Prov. 16:18)
- Simmering Bitterness (Eph. 5:21)
- Sexual Immorality (Colossians 3:5)
- Materialism (Colossians 3:5)
- Prayerlessness (James 4:2)
- Filthy Language (Colossians 3:8)
- Envy (Galatians 5:21)
- Drunkenness & Drugs (Galatians 5:21)
- B. If we are to be more than conquerors, we must pray about everything, both the small and great, continuing always in prayer. God's Word tells us to, "Pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17).

II. Conquer with More Promises

"For all the promises of God in Him are yea, and in Him Amen, unto the glory of God by us" (2 Corinthians 1:20).

- A. Some Christians falter when it comes to reading, remembering, and relying on God's promises. They unsuccessfully depend on their own strength.
- B. If we are to be more than conquerors, we must trust God and depend on His promises. The Bible says, "There hath not failed one word of all His good promise" (1 Kings 8:56).

III. Conquer with More Peace

"And the peace of God...shall keep your hearts and minds" (Philippians 4:7).

A. Some Christians fail to be victorious because they lack God's peace. They live with fear and doubts rather than with faith and confidence.

B. If we are to be more than conquerors, we must partake of God's peace. Jesus said, "My peace I give unto you...Let not your heart be troubled" (John 14:27). We must simply accept the peace He offers.

IV. Conquer with More Praise

"But I will hope continually, and will yet praise thee more and more" (Psalm 71:14).

- A. Many Christians are remiss when it comes to praising the Lord. They wear long faces, possess negative attitudes, and lack victory.
- B. If we are to be more than conquerors, we must praise the Lord more. The psalmist said, "While I live I will praise the Lord: I will sing praises unto my God while I have any being" (Psalm 146:2). He also said, "I will bless the Lord at all times: his praise shall continually be in my mouth" (Psalm 34:1)
